Garbage pickup will be on schedule during the entire month of April.

Memorial Day

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 29th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, May 29th through Friday, June 2nd. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 5, 2017.

Independence Day

Tuesday, July 4, 2017

There will be NO garbage pickup on Tuesday, July 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Tuesday, July 4th through Friday, July 7th. Garbage pickup for Monday, July 3rd will be picked up on schedule. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, July 10, 2017.

Composting program scheduled to begin the week of April 3, 2017

A special yard waste collection truck will operate in the City from April 3rd through December 8th only.

NO COMPOST OR YARD WASTE WILL BE PICKED UP AFTER DECEMBER 8, 2017.

BEGINNING APRIL 3rd, please do one of the three following things to eliminate yard waste:

- 1. COMPOST YOUR YARD WASTE AT HOME.
- 2. PLACE ALL COMPOST AT THE CURB IN A 25- TO 35-GALLON REFUSE CONTAINER MARKED "COMPOST". THESE CONTAINERS WILL NOT BE EMPTIED IF THEY CONTAIN ANYTHING OTHER THAN YARD WASTE.
- 3. PLACE YARD WASTE IN LARGE

Compost must be placed at the curb for collection with your household refuse by 7 AM on your regular pick-up day. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Brush must be cut into four feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds each or measure over 18" in diameter. Large logs over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up.

We recommend that residents comply with the City's composting guidelines to help us with our efforts in keeping up with constantly changing environmental standards and still provide efficient and economical refuse collection service within the City of Mount Clemens.

PLEASE REMEMBER, RAKING LEAVES OR GRASS INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

Spring Cleaning

As the warmer weather approaches,

many of us begin our spring cleaning. It is important to remember that it is not just the inside of our homes that need a good cleaning, but the exterior as well. The Homeowner's Self Test for Blight will help you as you take a walk around your property and begin your spring clean-up. This checklist outlines the primary uses, structures, activities and conditions that are defined as blight by Mount Clemens City Ordinances. The Community **Development Department wants** to work with residents to enhance the quality of life in the community by protecting the character and stability of residential and commercial areas. Maintaining your property helps to maintain property values for not only your own property, but for the community as a whole.

If the City identifies blight throughout the community, property owners will receive a violation notice, describing the nature of the violation and a timeframe within which it should be taken care of. If this timeframe lapses without any progress, the City will often send a second notice of violation, again giving a timeframe for compliance. If the property is not brought into compliance or progress has not been made, the City will then issue a court summons through the 41-B District Court. Once a case is in the court system, final penalties, fees, etc, are decided by the court and its judges.

HOMEOWNER'S SELF TEST FOR BLIGHT

All of the following items currently are defined as blight under the Elimination of Blight Ordinance, Section 19.002.

Take a stroll around your property and check off any of the following items that you may find to exist at your house or rental property.

- \square The open storage of any litter, ☐ The storage of a roll off junk, debris, rubbish, or refuse on your property or in your street.
- ☐ The accumulation of stagnant water in a swimming pool, containers or tires that can be conducive to mosquito breeding.
- ☐ The infestation of any property or premises by insects, rodents or other vermin.
- ☐ The storage of unlicensed/ inoperable motor vehicles, boats, recreational vehicles and utility trailers in the street or on your private property.
- ☐ The storage of licensed/ operable motor vehicles, boats, recreational vehicles and utility trailers on the grass or dirt of your property.
- ☐ The open storage of building supplies and materials on any property, without a valid active Building Permit.
- ☐ The use of tents, port-a-johns, or trailers for a period longer than 7 days, unless approved by the Planning Commission or Community Development and is included on a site plan.

- dumpster on your property for more than 48 hours after the necessary repairs have been done.
- ☐ The existence of a partially completed structure that does not have a valid Building Permit in force, or has not been completed in a reasonable time
- ☐ The failure to maintain landscaping, mow the lawn regularly, trim all shrubbery, eliminate all noxious weeds or shovel the snow.
- \square The existence of peeling paint, missing siding, roofs in disrepair, broken or missing gutters or windows and unsafe porches and stairs.
- ☐ The existence of any structure that's damaged by fire or other natural disasters or by neglect is deemed uninhabitable as a dwelling.
- ☐ The existence of any vacant building that's open to trespass or that is in such severe disrepair that it allows entry by persons or elements.

SMART 9-1-1

Most 9-1-1 calls are made from a cellular phone, with very little information provided to a dispatcher. With Smart 9-1-1, call takers and first responders will have additional information that can be used to facilitate the proper response to your location. You can sign up, at no cost, at www.smart911.com, and include your address, vehicles you own, medical alerts, emergency contacts, access information, download photos of your pets or family. Citizens can create their own safety profile and when 911 is called, your safety profile is automatically displayed to the 9-1-1 call taker.
