## **Spring Cleaning**

many of us begin our spring cleaning. It is important to remember that it is not just the inside of our homes that need a good cleaning, but the exterior as well.

The Homeowner's Self Test for Blight will help you as you take a walk around your property and begin your spring clean-up. This checklist outlines the primary uses, structures, activities and conditions that are City Ordinances. The Community **Development Department wants** to work with residents to enhance

the quality of life in the community

by protecting the character and stability of residential and commercial areas. Maintaining your property helps to maintain property values.

If the City identifies blight throughout the community, property owners will receive a violation notice, describing  $_{ullet}$  to the Treasurer's Office and making the nature of the violation and a timeframe within which it should be taken care of. If this timeframe lapses without any progress, the City will often send a second notice of violation, again giving a timeframe for compliance. If the property is not brought into compliance or progress • as possible, by simply calling 211. continued on page 4

Monday, May 28, 2018 There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 28th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, May 28<sup>th</sup> through Friday, June 1<sup>st</sup>. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 4, 2018.

#### **Independence Day**

Wednesday, July 4, 2018 There will be NO garbage pickup on Wednesday, July 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Wednesday, July 4<sup>th</sup> through Friday, July 6<sup>th</sup> only. Garbage pickup for Monday, July 2<sup>nd</sup> and Tuesday, July 3<sup>rd</sup> will be picked up on schedule. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, July 9, 2018.

# Composting program scheduled to begin the week of April 2, 2018

A special yard waste collection truck will operate in the City from April 2nd through December 7th only.

NO COMPOST OR YARD WASTE WILL BE PICKED UP AFTER DECEMBER 7, 2018.

BEGINNING APRIL 2<sup>nd</sup>, please do one of the three following things to eliminate yard waste:

1. COMPOST YOUR YARD WASTE AT HOME.

2. PLACE ALL COMPOST AT THE CURB • Upcoming Election IN A 25- TO 35-GALLON REFUSE CONTAINER MARKED "COMPOST". THESE CONTAINERS WILL NOT BE EMPTIED IF THEY CONTAIN ANYTHING OTHER THAN YARD WASTE

3. PLACE YARD WASTE IN LARGE

Compost <u>must</u> be placed at the curb • 9, 2018. for collection with your household refuse by 7 AM on your regular pickup day. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Brush must be cut into four feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds each or measure over 18" in diameter. Large logs over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked

We recommend that residents comply with the City's composting guidelines to help us with our efforts in keeping up with constantly changing environmental standards and still provide efficient and economical refuse collection service within the City of Mount Clemens.

PLEASE REMEMBER, RAKING LEAVES OR GRASS INTO THE STREET IN THE **CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS STRICTLY** PROHIBITED.

# Fire Safety Tips

What's New?

Electrical fires are one of the leading causes of structure fires annually. With more and more home electronics, the need for plug space becomes limited. You never should overload outlets. Here are some tips that can use to stay safe.

Captains Richard DeCaussin, Greg Hoppe and Gregg Shipman

- 1. Never plug more than two appliances into an outlet at once. Only use outlets designed to handle multiple plugs.
- 2. Know the amount of power you're placing on that outlet.
- 3. Appliances like stoves, refrigerators and air-conditioners should be on their own wall outlet since they are heavy power users.
- 4. Overloading of a circuit could be an issue if your circuit breakers or fuses keep tripping or blowing.
- 5. Never remove a ground from a three-prong appliance to make it fit in a two-slot outlet.
- 6. Use extension cords for temporary projects or temporary use only.
- 7. Use power strips that have internal overload protection.

#### **Grill Safety Tips**

Spring is right around the corner and so is grilling season. Here are a few simple tips about grill safety to get us ready for a great spring and summer.

- 1. Propane and gas grills should be used in the great outdoors only.
- 2. Never leave your grill unattended.
- 3. The lid on propane grills should always be open when lighting it.
- 4. Your grill should be placed away from you home, siding, deck rails, eaves or any other overhanging structures.
- 5. Always remove any grease build up in the grill trays below.

continued from page 1 has not been made, the City will then issue a court summons through the 41-B District Court. Once a case is in the court system, final penalties, fees, etc, are decided by the court and its judges.

# HOMEOWNER'S SELF TEST FOR BLIGHT

All of the following items currently are defined as blight under the Elimination of Blight Ordinance, Section 19.002.

Take a stroll around your property and check off any of the following items that you may find to exist at your house or rental property.

- The open storage of any litter, junk, debris, rubbish, or refuse on your property or in your street.
- The accumulation of stagnant water in a swimming pool, containers or tires that can be conducive to mosquito breeding.
- The infestation of any property or premises by insects, rodents or other vermin.
- The storage of unlicensed/ inoperable motor vehicles, boats, recreational vehicles and utility trailers in the street or on your private property.
- The storage of licensed/ operable motor vehicles, boats, recreational vehicles and utility trailers on the grass or dirt of your property.
- The open storage of building supplies and materials on any property, without a valid active Building Permit.
- The use of tents, port-a-johns, or trailers for a period longer than 7 days, unless approved by the Planning Commission or Community Development and is included on a site plan.

- The storage of a roll off dumpster on your property for more than 48 hours after the necessary repairs have been
- The existence of a partially completed structure that does not have a valid Building Permit in force, or has not been completed in a reasonable time
- The failure to maintain landscaping, mow the lawn regularly, trim all shrubbery, eliminate all noxious weeds or shovel the snow.
- The existence of peeling paint, missing siding, roofs in disrepair, broken or missing gutters or windows and unsafe porches and stairs.
- The existence of any structure that's damaged by fire or other natural disasters or by neglect is deemed uninhabitable as a dwelling.
- The existence of any vacant building that's open to trespass or that is in such severe disrepair that it allows entry by persons or elements.

- Curb Appeal | Overall appearance of yard; green lawn, walks edged, shrubs, bushes, and trees maintained
- Innovation and Landscape Design | Total effect, enhancement of home and property, unusual use of accents and decorative material (Artificial flowers fall under this category; they will not be judged for the use in your landscape plants)
