No Knock List

- Spring is the time when many door-
- to-door solicitors descend upon
- residential neighborhoods, but not
- all residents wish to receive these unexpected visits. In order to protect
- our residents from any unwanted
- interruptions, the City Clerk's Office has established a residential "No
- Knock" list. This list is given to all
- solicitors upon issuance of a door-to-
- door solicitation permit. The solicitors
- are advised at that time NOT to solicit
- at the addresses on the list. A "No

to those on our "No Knock" list as a further reminder to the solicitors

Door-to-door solicitation is permitted in Mount Clemens, however, all solicitors must be licensed by the City and possess a solicitor's license from the City Clerk's Office. Exempt • from the license requirement are

- religious groups, certain charitable
- organizations, minors soliciting for
- an educational, religious or youth
- organization, and candidates
- running for office. Licensed door-to- door solicitors are only permitted to • call on residences between the hours

of 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM.

Residents are advised not to provide any information to door-to-door solicitors, such as copies of utility or • phone bills. Account numbers can • be lifted from these documents and unauthorized switching of companies

Spring Cleaning

11 AM - 8 PM • As the warmer weather approaches, 10 AM − 6 PM many of us begin our spring • cleaning. It is important to remember that it is not just the inside of our homes that need a good cleaning, but the exterior as well. The Homeowner's Self Test for Blight will help you as you take a walk around your property and begin ^{1 PM} • your spring clean-up. This checklist • outlines the primary uses, structures, • activities, and conditions that are defined as blight by Mount Clemens City Ordinances. The Community • Development Department wants $^{8\,\text{AM}}$ • to work with residents to enhance • the quality of life in the community by protecting the character and stability of residential and commercial areas. Maintaining your property helps to maintain property values for not only your own property, but for the community as • a whole.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

If the City identifies blight throughout the community, property owners will receive a violation notice, describing the nature of the violation and a timeframe within which it should be taken care of. If this timeframe lapses without any progress, the City will often send a second notice of violation, again giving a timeframe for compliance. If the property is not brought into compliance or progress has not been made, the City will then issue a court summons through the 41-B District Court. Once a case is in the court system, final penalties, fees, etc, are decided by the court and its judges.

Good Friday

Garbage pickup will be on schedule during the entire month of April.

Memorial Day

Monday, May 27, 2019 There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 27th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, May 27th through Friday, May 31st. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 3, 2019.

Independence Day

Thursday, July 4, 2019

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, July 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Thursday, July 4th through Friday, July 5th. Garbage pickup for Monday, July 1st, Tuesday, July 2nd, and Wednesday July 3rd will be picked up on schedule.

Composting program scheduled to begin the week of April 1, 2019

A special yard waste collection truck will operate in the City from April 1st through December 6th only.

NO COMPOST OR YARD WASTE WILL BE PICKED UP AFTER DECEMBER 6,

BEGINNING APRIL 1st, please do one of the three following things to eliminate yard waste:

- 1. COMPOST YOUR YARD WASTE AT HOMF.
- 2. PLACE ALL COMPOST AT THE CURB IN A 25- TO 35-GALLON REFUSE CONTAINER MARKED "COMPOST". THESE CONTAINERS WILL NOT BE EMPTIED IF THEY CONTAIN ANYTHING OTHER THAN YARD WASTE.
- 3. PLACE YARD WASTE IN LARGE 30-GALLON BROWN PAPER BAGS. •

Compost <u>must</u> be placed at the curb • you must be: for collection with your household refuse by 7 AM on your regular pickup day. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Brush must be cut into four feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds each or measure over 18" in diameter. Large $_{ullet}$ July 23, 2019 at 4:00 PM in the Mount logs over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked

We recommend that residents comply with the City's composting guidelines to help us with our efforts in keeping up with constantly changing environmental standards while still providing efficient and economical refuse collection service within the City of Mount Clemens.

Property Taxes

Any 2018 property taxes with balances remaining have been transferred to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office for collection. Payments must be made to: Macomb County Treasurer, 1 S. Main St, Mount Clemens, MI 48043. The phone number is 586.469.5190, and the website is: www.macombcountymi.gov/ <u>treasurer/index.htm</u>.

The 2019 summer taxes will be sent out July 1, 2019, and will be due on September 16, 2019.

Tax Deferment

Senior citizens, veterans, and permanently disabled individuals may apply for a tax deferment starting July 1, 2019. In order to qualify, seniors must be 62 or older and have an income that does not exceed \$40,000. All applications must be returned by September 16, 2019. If you cannot come into the Treasurer's Office to complete a form, please call us and we will mail one to you.

Convenient Ways to Pay Your Bills

You can pay your current year taxes (only available July 1st through February 28th), water bills, and parking tickets, online at www. cityofmountclemens.com, or over the phone at 1.866.789.5536. When paying online, the link is right on our home page - just scroll down a

little bit. Please keep in mind that a processing fee will be applied to these payments. If you have any questions regarding this service, please call the Treasurer's Office at 586.469.6818 x1. A secure drop box is also available 24 hours a day, just inside the first door of city hall. We also have a drive-up drop box located on the west side of the municipal lot, across from the gazebo. Please do not deposit cash.

Did You Receive a Past Due Notice?

Please contact our office BEFORE your scheduled shut-off date to make payment arrangements. You can prevent a shut-off by simply coming in and signing for payment arrangements. Once we have

initiated shut-off, the entire balance is due, including a \$35 service fee. We will accept cash, money order, or credit card (fee applies). If you cannot make a payment towards your bill, please contact an agency for help as soon as possible. Simply call 211 for help.
