

Welcome to the new and improved Clementime's Newsletter! We are so proud to be partnering with the Mount Clemens Public Library to bring a comprehensive quarterly newsletter. Construction has begun in the City of Mount Clemens with many exciting new developments! These projects include the completion of the Edison Crossing Project on the horizon, the demolition of the former Victory Inn hotel in progress, Southbound Gratiot repaving project wrapping up and we are preparing for the Cherry Street Mall construction to begin spring 2024. What an exciting time to see all these important developments happening in our city! We continue to see significant investments from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, the State of Michigan, and many other grant funders.

This year The Macomb County Chamber will present the Mount Clemens State of the City address on September 29, 2023, 8:00 a.m. at the historic Emerald Theater. November 7, 2023, the city will conduct our local elections. Three, four-year term commission seats, one two-year term commission seat, and the mayor position will be on this year's ballot. Make sure to review where your precinct is located or apply for your absentee ballot.

Your city commission will be anticipating the results from the State's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund & Clean Water State Revolving Fund applications. It is our hope that the city receives adequate funding in order to make necessary water improvements.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMEN

ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS BUREAU

As a part of the 2022-2023 budget that was adopted by the city commission, its strategic plan included the following action item:

Finalize the research and cost/benefit analysis regarding the establishment of an administrative hearing board (bureau) to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of enforcing the property maintenance code.

Throughout 2022, city administrative researched this item, and in December 2022, the city commission adopted an ordinance that created an administrative hearings bureau for the enforcement of certain city ordinances.

An administrative hearings bureau is authorized by state law (The Home Rule City Act 279 of 1909) and allows blight and other ordinance violations to be heard and administered directly by the city through an administrative hearings officer, who must be an attorney licensed to practice law in Michigan for at least 5 year and is appointed by the city commission. This method for enforcing certain ordinances removes the penalty of a criminal misdemeanor and provides the hearings officer the ability to levy fines of up to \$10,000. All fines are set by the city commission. By no longer going to district court for the enforcement of certain ordinances, this gives the city the ability to control the timing of when cases are heard. The goal of the administrative hearings bureau will be to work with property owners in a cooperative fashion to seek compliance, and to beautify the city and make it a safer place to be.

The bureau conducted its first hearing in May, with hearings scheduled to take place on a monthly basis. For more information, please check out the city website at www.mountclemens.gov under Code Enforcement &

MOUNT CLEMENS STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN

The collection of stormwater is an important responsibility of the City of Mount Clemens. The City maintains storm sewer infrastructure ranging from local street drainage to large diameter collection pipes. In Mount Clemens, most stormwater is collected in catch basins and makes its way into the Clinton River. The City also maintains approximately stormwater outfalls to the Clinton River and Greiner Drain. These surface water discharges are permitted by the State of Michigan by a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Stormwater permit.

How can you help?

- 1. Never sweep or blow leaves into a storm drain.
- 2. Use proper methods to dispose or recycle leaves.
- 3. Take used oil to a certified used oil collection center.
- 4. Follow directions on pesticides and fertilizers and avoid application when rain is forecasted.
- 5. Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly to keep bacteria and parasites out of our groundwater and lakes.



The November 7, 2023 City Election will include the following races:

From there, enter your address in the box on the left side of the page and hit "Enter." Your precinct and its location will then be displayed on the page.

Extended Hours for City Clerk's Office

The Mount Clemens City Clerk's Office will be open on Saturday, November 4, 2023, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. to assist voters with voter registration, and absentee ballots.

Early Voting is Here!

The passage of Michigan's Proposal 2022-2 allows voters to go to an election polling site in the nine days prior to every state and federal election and cast their ballot.

All 2024 state and federal elections will have the full nine days of early voting prior to each election at Mount Clemens City Hall.

Important Dates for the November 7, 2023 City Election

- September 28, 2023 Absent voter ballots available for voters.
- October 23, 2023 Last day to register in any manner other than in-person at the city clerk's office for the November 7, 2023 election.
- November 1, 2023 Public accuracy test of voting equipment at 9:00 a.m.
- November 4, 2023 City Clerk's office opens from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. for voter registration and absentee ballots.
- November 3, 2023 Last day to have an absentee ballot mailed to a voter.
- November 6, 2023 Last day to obtain an absentee ballot (in person at city clerk's office) by 4:00 p.m.
- November 7, 2023 Election Day. Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.
- November 13, 2023 Swearing-In Ceremony of Mount Clemens Mayor and City Commissioners at City Hall.



ABSENTEE VOTING BALLOT

The New Permanent Absent Voter Ballot Application – One and Done!

Michigan voters can now complete a **single** application to request absentee ballots for all future elections. This means that the days of filling out an absent voter application for every election are long gone. Mount Clemens voters who wish to automatically receive a ballot for every election, can simply complete and return the form below and not have to complete another application for an absentee ballot again. WARNING: You must be a United States citizen to vote. If you are not a United States citizen, you will not be issued an absent voter ballot. A person making a false statement in this absent voter ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. It is a violation of Michigan election law for a person other than those listed in the instructions to return, offer to return, agree to return, or solicit to return your absent voter ballot application to the clerk. An assistant authorized by the clerk who receives absent voter ballot applications at a location other than the clerk's office must have credentials signed by the clerk. Ask to see his or her credentials before entrusting your application with a person claiming to have the clerk's authorization to return your application.

HOLIDAY REFUSE CALENDAR



Labor Day - Monday, September 4, 2023

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 4th, through Friday, September 8th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 11, 2023.

Columbus Day – Monday, October 9, 2023

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire month of October.

Veteran's Day – Saturday, November 11, 2023

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during Veteran's Day week - November 6th through November 10th.

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 23, 2023

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 23rd. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 24th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 25th. Garbage pickup for Monday, November 20th, Tuesday, November 21st, and Wednesday, November 22nd will be on schedule.

COMPOST/LEAF PICKUP SEASON ENDS DECEMBER 8TH

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. RAKING AND BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS PROHIBITED. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees **MUST** be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.

A city contracted yard waste collection truck will operate through December 8, 2023 <u>only</u>. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste. **YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP**. Brush piles and yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers marked "COMPOST" or "YARD WASTE" that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Place all yard waste at curbside no earlier than 6 p.m. the day before your scheduled pick up day and **NO LATER THAN 7:00 A.M.** of your scheduled pick up day.

ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY.

Please remember that following city policy will not only be appreciated by the City of Mount Clemens, but also by your neighbor who has been taking the time to bag their leaves.

The city will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The city will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the fall season.



UNDERSTANDING THE NUMBERS

Average Sale Price - Neutral: While sellers always like increasing prices, in markets where affordability is an issue slight decreases can help to boost sales as is seen below.

Number of Sales - Healthy: While down from a year ago when interest rates were rising lower than today, the acceptance of these now higher rates by consumers is reflected in the rise in the number of sales between the first quarter of 2023 and the second quarter.

Days on Market (DOM) - Neutral: While sellers are accustomed to a faster pace, the longer time to sell is still well below the typical 72 day average.

Inventory - Poor: Fewer homes for sale will increase competition for homes, and drive prices up as demand remains strong. But fewer homes for sale will also mean fewer homes can be sold.

Absorption Rate - Seller's Market: An absorption rate over 40% is an abusive seller's market resulting in buyers being unable to purchase without all cash and waiving due diligence protections is gone. Buyers need to remain aggressive when they find a home they really want as evidenced by the fact that 58.1% of all homes sold in Q2 of 2023 sold for 100% of asking price or higher.

An absorption rate between 15.4% and 18.3% is considered a market in balance. Higher favors sellers, lower favors buyers.


