

NOVEMBER 4, 2025 CITY ELECTION

The next election in the city of Mount Clemens is Tuesday, November 4, 2025. Application materials are available in the City Clerk's Office for the following races in the November 4, 2025 City Election:

Mayor – One (1) to be elected for a 2-year term

City Commission – Three (3) to be elected for a 4-year term



To qualify as a candidate, you must be:

- At least 18 years of age.
- A registered voter.
- A resident of the city for at least 365 days immediately prior to the last day of filing for office.

The deadline for application materials is Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. in the Mount Clemens city clerk's office.

BUSINESS REGISTRATIONS ARE DUE

The Mount Clemens City Clerk's office mailed nearly 700 business registration applications to Mount Clemens businesses this spring. In accordance with City Ordinance 20.284, businesses are required to register annually with the City Clerk. This registration is necessary so that the city can keep adequate records of the types and locations of business activities, and to ensure that adequate services can be supplied by the fire, police and DPS departments. Business registrations also provide city officials with important emergency contact information.

Business registration forms and fees are due June 30, 2025. All business registrations received after that date will be assessed a \$25 penalty fee.

TREASURER'S OFFICE

SUMMER TAX BILLS

All residents will receive their 2025 Summer Tax Bill around July 1st. If your taxes are paid by your mortgage company, please keep this for your records. Summer taxes are due by September 15, 2025. If you are unable to pay the entire amount due, you may make payments toward your balance at any time, starting July 1st. We do not make payment arrangements on taxes. If paying in person, we will issue you a receipt with your remaining balance due. After September 15th, a 4% flat penalty will be added to any remaining balance. This amount will not be penalized again until March 1, 2026, when it is turned over to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office. DELINQUENT TRANSFER TO TAX FEE

Any delinquent bill that is moved onto the property taxes will incur a 15% fee. This fee will not apply to sidewalk invoices.

SENIOR DEFERMENTS FOR TAXES

If you are 62 or over before December 31, 2025, (or you are permanently disabled) and your income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed \$40,000, you are eligible to apply for a deferment of your homestead summer property taxes. This form must be filled out and signed **each year** between July 1st and September 15th and will give you until February 28, 2026 to pay your summer taxes without penalty. DELINQUENT WATER BILLS

Water shut offs are conducted on or after the 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please be mindful of your water balance and contact the Treasurer's Office for payment arrangements, if necessary. If you need assistance paying your bill, call 211 for available options.

RIVERFRONT GAZEBO

A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF REYNOLDS

Good Day Mount Clemens,

Summer is finally here. Outdoor activities and BBQs are on the agenda city wide! I am confident we all share excitement about summer-time activities, but I would like to take just a moment and share with you some tips to ensure summer 2025 is a happy, healthy, and safe one for all of Mount Clemens.

Did you know...

- According to data from the Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2017-2021, an average of 22,155 patients per year went to emergency rooms because of injuries involving grills.
- Gas grills were involved in an average of 9,079 home fires annually
 nationwide, including 4,454 structure fires and 4,625 outdoor fires annually.
 Leaks or breaks were primarily a problem with gas grills. Six percent of gas
 grill structure fires and 15% of outside gas grill fires were caused by leaks or
 breaks.

What can we infer from these statistics? Quite simply that BBQ Grills can be dangerous if used incorrectly. Let's review a few simple safety tips you can use to prevent a mishap this summer.

- For propane grills, check the gas tank for leaks before use.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Place the grill well away from the home, deck railings, and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grilling area.
- If you use starter fluid when charcoal grilling, only use charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire. When you have or are finished grilling, let the coals cool completely before disposing in a metal container.
- Never leave your grill unattended when in use.

Also please remember that gasoline and other volatile liquids should NEVER be used to start a grill or outdoor fire; gasoline vapors can literally explode and cause serious injuries.

Enjoy the summer of 2025, and be sure to come to the fire station if you need a smoke detector for your Mount Clemens home.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS 2025 CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

1. Hubbard Street Pavement Repairs

The City received federal funding through the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to perform concrete pavement rehabilitation on Hubbard Street from the Canadian National Railroad tracks east to North Avenue. This is a continuation of Phase I of the project completed last year. Construction is planned to begin in late summer.

2. Downtown Revitalization Project

The City's Downtown will be revitalized and turned into a walkable plaza. Improvements include increasing the area's walkability with pedestrian corridors along Macomb Place and Cherry Street, underground infrastructure replacement, fountain stage replacement and site amenity upgrades.

3. New Street Parking Lot Reconstruction

Located at the intersection of New Street and Pine Street, the New Street parking lot will be reconstructed. Improvements include a streamlined entrance and exit, replacement of pavement and storm sewers, relocation of trash bins into an enclosure, EV parking spots and new parking payment kiosks. Work is expected to begin in early summer 2025.

4. Grand Avenue Water Main Replacement

Approximately 2,700 feet of 8-inch water main has been replaced along Grand Avenue between Southbound Gratiot Avenue and N Wilson Blvd. This will bring improvements to the water quality and overall efficiency of the water distribution system.

5. Grand Avenue Reconstruction


Following the completion of the water main, Grand Avenue is slated for a full reconstruction Pavement replacement is expected begin in May and continue through the summer.

6. District 1 Sidewalk Program

The City is continuing its sidewalk program this year with District 1, scheduled to begin in May. District 1 will have hazardous and defective concrete sidewalks removed and replaced. The district limits are outlined on the map. Some miscellaneous repairs will be conducted outside of the district as needed.

8. GLWA Water Connection

The City received federal funding to connect the City's water system to the Great Lakes Water Authority. Work on the storage tank is expected to begin in the fall 2025.

There will be NO garbage pickup on Friday ONLY, July 4th. Friday's pickup will be on Saturday, July 5th. Garbage pickup for Monday, June 30th through Thursday, July 3rd, will be picked up **on schedule**.

Labor Day - Monday, September 1, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 1st. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 1st, through Friday, September 5th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 8, 2025.

LEAF PICKUP POLICY

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. RAKING AND BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS PROHIBITED. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees **MUST** be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.

ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY. YOUR COMPLETE COOPERATION WILL BE APPRECIATED.

The City will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The City will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the Fall season.

A City contracted yard waste collection truck will operate on your garbage day. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste. YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. Brush piles and yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers marked "COMPOST" or "YARD WASTE" that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Place all yard waste at curbside no earlier than 6 p.m. the day before your scheduled pick-up day and **NO LATER THAN** 7:00 A.M. of your scheduled pick-up day.

Please remember that following City policy will not only be appreciated by the City of Mount Clemens, but also by your neighbor who has been taking the time to bag their leaves.

Mount Clemens Storm Water Management Plan

The collection of storm water is an important responsibility of the City of Mount Clemens. The City maintains storm sewer infrastructure ranging from local street drainage to large diameter collection pipes. In Mount Clemens most storm water is collected in catch basins and makes its way into the Clinton River. The City also maintains storm water outfalls to the Clinton River and Greiner Drain. These surface water discharges are permitted by the State of Michigan by a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Storm Water permit.

The Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) for the City of Mount Clemens is available on the City's website for public comment.
