## **Winter Tax Bills**

Residents should have received a winter tax bill in the mail around December 1, 2022, and it is due by February 28, 2023. Any 2022 tax amount that remains unpaid after that date will be transferred to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office for collection. You may call their office at 586-469-5190 for more information. Every resident receives a tax bill, even if their taxes are paid by a mortgage company. Please keep this tax bill for income tax purposes. All delinquent bills that are moved to the property taxes will now incur a 15% fee, effective with teh Summer 2023 tax bill. This fee will not apply to sidewalk invoices.

Fee-Free Option for Paying Water Bills

The Treasurer's Office now offers an option to pay your water bill by ACH check for no fee. You will be required to fill out a form in our office, providing your routing and bank account information. Your water bill balance will automatically be drafted from your bank account on the due date each nonth. For more information, stop in or call

# 2023 Holiday Garbage Pickup Schedule

### February

Presidents Day - Monday, February 20

Garbage pickup will be on schedule during the entire month.

## May

Memorial Day - Monday, May 29

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 29th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week

beginning Monday, May 29th through Friday, June 2nd. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 5, 2023.

## **Compost/Brush Pickup**

Yard waste collection is picked up on your regular garbage day starting April until November. Place your yard waste loose in a 32-gallon or smaller refuse container labeled "yard waste" or "compost" Place yard waste in a 30-gallon brown paper leaf bag. Please do not blow grass or leaves into the street.

#### July

Independence Day - Tuesday, July 4

There will be NO garbage pickup on Tuesday, July 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Tuesday, July 4th through Friday, July 7th. Garbage pickup for Monday, July 3rd will be picked up on schedule. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, July 10, 2023

## September

Labor Day - Monday, September 4

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 5th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Tuesday, September 6th through Friday, September 9th.

#### October

Columbus Day – Monday, October 9

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire month.

#### November

Veteran's Day – Saturday, November 11

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during Veteran's Day week

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 23

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 23rd. Garbage pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Thursday, November 23rd. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 24th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 25th.

#### December

Christmas Day – Monday, December 25

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, December 25th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Monday, December 25th through Friday, December 29th.

# City Election: Call for Candidates!

Application materials will be available in the City Clerk's Office in early March for the following races in the November 7, 2023, City Election:

Mayor – One (1) to be elected for a 2-year term.

City Commission – Three (3) to be elected for a 4-year term.

To qualify as a candidate, you must be:

- At least 18 years of age.
- A registered voter.
- A resident of the city for at least 365 days immediately prior to the last day of filing for office.

# Winter Snow Removal & Snow Emergency Information

The street department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear. This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the city has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the city may declare a "snow emergency" per City of Mount Clemens Ordinance #30.030. Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Vehicles not removed from the streets during a snow emergency may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, or the snow emergency has been terminated, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

As a very walkable community, with an extended network of sidewalks, it is also critical that residents and businesses do their part to keep the sidewalks clear of snow and ice for both safety and quality of life concerns.

City ordinances require that "the occupant of any premises, or the owner of any unoccupied premises, is required to keep the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to such premises cleared, so far as is practicable and reasonable, from snow and ice to facilitate pedestrian use. Where there are no sidewalks, the occupant or owner shall clear a path free from snow and ice where a sidewalk would otherwise be, to facilitate pedestrian use. Whenever any snow or ice has fallen or accumulated, it shall be cleared within 12 hours after it has fallen or accumulated."

Failure to remove the snow and ice accordingly may result in the city of issuing a violation notice or performing the task and billing the responsible property owner. If you should have any questions, please feel free to contact the Department of Public Services at (586) 469-6847 We all hope this winter season is not a harsh one, but in the event that it is, the city thanks you in advance for your diligence in keeping the sidewalks of Mount Clemens safe.
