#### 2020 Accomplishments:

- Hired City Manager, Don Johnson
- Formulated a new Strategic Plan that included six new goals, a revised mission statement and a new vision for the city.

  - Hired three new firefighters
    - Hired a fire chief
  - Removed rotten tables and benches from Cherry Street Mall

#### **Winter Snow Removal**

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. Onstreet parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the City may declare a "Snow Emergency" per City of Mount Clemens Ordinance #30.030. Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Vehicles not removed from the streets during a Snow Emergency may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, or the Snow Emergency has been terminated, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

In order to qualify as a candidate, you must be:


- At least 18 years of age.

# Community & Economic Development Brian Tingley Community Development Director

2020 was a challenging year for all of us. From our residents and businesses, to our government leaders and city staff, we all had to pivot and face new challenges

brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. Although there were many obstacles to overcome throughout the year, there were also several exciting and



impactful advancements. As the state began to shut down most of the business world in March, city staff was still active and assisting in one of the most ambitious construction projects in recent years; the Wayne and Joan Weber Emergency and Trauma Center at McLaren Macomb hospital. Even during the shutdown, city staff continued to provide building inspection services to ensure this critical project moved forward. After just over two years of construction, the new emergency and trauma center opened in June. I would like to personally thank the staff in the community development department for assisting with this project during a very challenging

As the city moved into the summer, it began a strategic planning process that ultimately resulted in several goals and objectives, including a renewed effort on economic development collaboration among city administration, its Downtown

> Development Authority (DDA) and our partners at Macomb County. This resulted in two concrete steps. The first was a contract between the city and its DDA to have the community development

department provide executive director services to the DDA and for the city manager's office to provide social media services. The second was a contract between the city and Macomb County for a short term pilot program whereby the county will provide targeted economic development services

for downtown Mount Clemens. The goal is for the city and county to explore a longer-term arrangement at the conclusion of this pilot program. As we continue to move forward during this pandemic, we are hopeful that these arrangements set the stage for continued economic growth utilizing partnerships and collaborations.

Now that 2020 is behind us, we look forward to a spring and summer of revitalization. We want residents and visitors alike to rediscover the city and its downtown and make us the **Uptown of Macomb County.** To that end, we hope to set the stage for a grand reopening of the downtown, with a new city brand, new outdoor dining options and looking at ways to create outdoor physical places that are attractive, safe and welcoming.

#### Fire Safety Tips:

The New Year is upon us once again and what better way to ring in the New Year is with a couple friendly fire safety reminders!

- 1. Make sure all your smoke detectors are working. Replace batteries if needed and make sure you have the correct number of detectors for you home.
- 2. Have a conversation with family members about a fire escape plan and a meeting area.
- 3. If a fire is in your home, please get out and stay out. Do not go back in your home for any reason.
- 4. Make sure your fireplace is protected by a screen and the stack is clean.

5. Keep candles about a foot away from anything that could catch fire and remember to always put them out when you leave.

- 6. Make sure space heaters are 3 feet away from any curtains or furniture.
  - 7. Always clean lint out of dryer traps
  - 8. Replace frayed wires on any household appliance.
  - 9. A fire extinguisher in the kitchen is always recommended.

10. Matches, lighters and flammable liquids should be locked up from children.

11. Never run gas powered generators inside a garage or home.

12. If you have a fire hydrant in front of your home, please clear heavy snow around it.

#### **Water Tax Bills**

Residents should have received a winter tax bill in the mail around December 1, 2020, and it is due by March 1, 2021. Any 2020 tax amount that remains unpaid after that date will be transferred to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office for collection. You may call their office at 586.469.5190 for more information.

Every resident receives a tax bill, even if your taxes are paid by a mortgage company. Please keep this tax bill for income tax purposes.

#### **Dog & Cat Licenses**

You may now purchase 2021 animal licenses in the Treasurer's Office. All renewals must be made during the months of January and February, or a penalty will apply. You just need to bring the rabies certificate that is signed by the veterinarian. The fees are: \$8.00/neutered and \$15.00/not neutered.

## Sidewalk Program

The City of Mount Clemens Sidewalk Repair Program, established in 2017 by the City Commission, will continue in the Spring of 2021 with Districts 4 and 5. This program was developed to benefit all City residents to provide safe walkways • throughout the City. Since 2017 Districts 1 through 3 have been completed.

- In January 2021 the City will be sending out a public notice by US mail to all property owners in Districts 4 and 5 with more information on the sidewalk
- program. Per the City Sidewalk Ordinance property owners are responsible for • the replacement costs of the sidewalk fronting their property in the public right • of way.
- In March 2021 defective sidewalks in District 4 and 5 will be marked with
- $_{\bullet}$  orange spray paint. In May 2021 the City Contractor is scheduled to complete repairs on these sidewalks. The unit price to remove and replace a five foot
- by five foot slab of sidewalk will remain at \$160 again this year. The City allows
- the property owner to prepay the amount due to the City by July 1, 2021
- and receive a 10% discount. More information on prepayment, the special assessment payment program and other construction options will be included
- in the public notices planned to be sent in January to property owners in Districts 4 and 5.

#### Information from the City Manager

• Have you ever set out to do something only to find someone else already did it? One of the city commission's objectives in the strategic plan was to create a list of available human service resources.

Fortunately, before investing too much effort in compiling such a list, I came across "The Right Connection" resource directory. This project was developed by the Macomb County Youth Council, a subcommittee of the Macomb County Inter-Agency Council, for use by service personnel in assisting families in locating free, low-cost or unique human services in Macomb County. It is available as a book or free on-line at the Macomb Intermediate School District web site: <a href="http://connection.misd.net/">http://connection.misd.net/</a>.

In either form, it is an extremely well-done directory of human services available to residents of Macomb County. The city will be making good use of this directory. I have already obtained extra copies for the sheriff's Mount

- Clemens substation. We have put a link to it on the city web site and city staff, who often receive phone calls
- from people in search of assistance, will have it available.
- The Macomb County Inter-Agency Council (IAC) was formed in 1964 by concerned Macomb County area citizens and human service agencies. Since IAC's inception, various programs have been established as a result
- of council activities to fulfill unmet service needs within Macomb County. You can learn more about IAC at
