Residents should have received a winter tax bill in the mail around December 1, 2021, and it is due by March 1, 2022. Every resident receives a tax bill, even if your taxes are paid by a mortgage company. Please keep this tax bill for income tax purposes.

Please bring the rabies certificate that is signed by the veterinarian. The fees are: \$8.00/neutered and \$15.00/not neutered. All renewals after February 28 will include a \$10 penalty.

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, July 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Tuesday, July 5th through Friday, July 8th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, July 11, 2022.

September

Labor Day - Monday, September 5

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 5th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Tuesday, September 6th through Friday, September 9th.

October

Columbus Day - Monday, October 10

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire month.

November

Veteran's Day - Friday, November 11

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during Veteran's Day week

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 24

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 24th. Garbage pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Thursday, November 24th. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 25th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 26th.

Clerk's Corner

Skip the Lines and Vote Absentee!

All Michigan voters may now vote by absentee ballot without a reason for every election! To make the process even easier, voters may register to be on the city's permanent absentee voter list. By doing so, voters will be automatically mailed an application requesting an absentee ballot for every election.

We hope that voters will take advantage of "no reason" absentee voting and enjoy the convenience of voting at home, while avoiding the lines on Election Day. To be placed on the permanent absentee list, please call the city clerk's office.

Unsolicited Voting Materials

Please note that the Mount Clemens City Clerk's Office does not send out unsolicited voter registration applications or absent voter ballot applications to residents. When residents receive these unsolicited voting materials, it is usually sent to them by political parties or voter interest groups. Because these third parties do not have access to any municipality's voter database, they do not know the status of voter registration and may send the applications to residents who are already registered--resulting in a great deal of confusion and frustration to voters. Similarly, these groups have been known to send absent voter ballot applications to voters who have already sent their completed application back to the city, prompting voters to believe that their original application was never received.

Residents who are unsure if they are registered to vote in Mount Clemens, or wish to check the status of their absentee ballot, may call the clerk's office at 586-469-6818, option #4, or visit the Michigan Voter Information Center online at www.michigan. gov/vote.

Winter Snow Removal & Snow Emergency Information

The street department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear. This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the city may declare a "snow emergency" per City of Mount Clemens Ordinance #30.030. Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Vehicles not removed from the streets during a snow emergency may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, or the Snow Emergency has been terminated, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

As a very walkable community, with an extended network of sidewalks, it is also critical that residents and businesses do their part to keep the sidewalks clear of snow and ice for both safety and quality of life concerns.

City ordinances require that "The occupant of any premises, or the owner of any unoccupied premises, is required to keep the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to such premises cleared, so far as is practicable and reasonable, from snow and ice to facilitate pedestrian use. Where there are no sidewalks, the occupant or owner shall clear a path free from snow and ice where a sidewalk would otherwise be, to facilitate pedestrian use. Whenever any snow or ice has fallen or accumulated, it shall be cleared within 12 hours after it has fallen or accumulated."

Failure to remove the snow and ice according may result in the city of issuing a violation notice or performing the task and billing the responsible property owner. We all hope this winter season is not a harsh one, but in the event that it is, the city thanks you in advance for your diligence in keeping the sidewalks of Mount Clemens safe.

Improvements to Your Cable Access Channels

This past fall, both Comcast Xfinity and WOW! TV+ made significant investments in Mount Clemens by improving the signal quality for the Government, Education and Public Access Channels. Both companies replaced old, analog equipment with digital signal encoders. These encoders have the capacity for high definition (HD) channels. WOW TV+ customers currently receive all three cable access channels in their HD channel lineups. Comcast Xfinity customers are still receiving cable access in standard definition signals, but the quality has improved dramatically. When Comcast moves cable access to their HD channel lineup, our station is ready and will require no further equipment upgrades.

Meet Your Firefighter

Mount Clemens Fire Lieutenant Tony Kirkum not only comes from a long line of Mount Clemens firefighters but is one of the city's favorite native sons as well. Born and bred in Mount Clemens, Tony graduated from Mount Clemens High School in 1990. He attended Western Michigan University as an English major and returned to Mount Clemens to attend the fire academy. He became a member of the Mount Clemens Volunteer Fire Department in 1993, just as his grandfather, father and brothers had done before him. The fire service is a rich family tradition in the Kirkum family, as Tony's father, Ken,

and brother, Chris, both held the title of Mount Clemens Fire Chief.

Tony began his service to the city of Mount Clemens by working in the Department of Public Service, until 2001 when he was hired as a full-time member of the Mount Clemens Fire Department. Tony received a promotion to Fire Lieutenant in 2019 but was diagnosed with cancer that same year. He has been bravely fighting cancer ever since, while still working for the fire department.

Tony and his wife, Michelle, have made their home in Mount Clemens and are raising their daughters, Alyson and Maggie here in the city. The family attends Trinity Lutheran Church, where the couple were married in 1995.

Tony continues to give back to the community by volunteering his free time to the Mount Clemens Old Crowd and the Mount Clemens Goodfellows. The Goodfellows is an organization that is very dear to the Kirkum family, as Tony's father and brothers also were members.

The Kirkum family's dedication to the city of Mount Clemens was forever memorialized by the renaming of Wilson Park to Ken Kirkum Memorial Park in honor of Tony's father. Tony and the entire Kirkum family will always be committed to serve and protect the city that they have come to love so much.
