As the weather gets warmer, people and their pets will be outdoors more often. Keep your pet on a leash or in a secured area for the safety of your neighbors as well as your pets. When you walk your pet, as a courtesy to your neighbors, please make sure you clean up after them. Also, the city does require that dogs and cats are licensed. If you need to obtain a license, they are available at the treasurer's office at One Crocker Boulevard with proof of current vaccinations.

Lost Dogs/Cats

Mount Clemens takes all stray animals to the Macomb County Animal Shelter. You may contact them at (586) 469-5115 to locate a lost animal. If an animal is licensed and wearing tags, the owner will be notified that the pet has been found. Please be a responsible pet owner and following these city policies:

- All dogs and cats must be licensed by January 1st of each year. A current RABIES vaccination certificate
 with expiration dates must be presented for either species in order to obtain a license.
- A household may have a total of four (4) dogs or cats, or a combination of both totaling (4).
- All dogs or cats must wear license tags when outside a building or residence or otherwise outdoors.
- All dogs and cats shall be kept under restraint (leashed) and not permitted to be at large.

Dogs and cats must be licensed even if they never leave the house.

Holiday Refuse Calendar

Labor Day – Monday, September 6,

There will be no garbage pickup on Monday, September 6th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Tuesday, September 7th through Friday, September 10th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 13, 2021.

Columbus Day – Monday, October 11, 2021

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire month of October.

Leaf Pickup Policy

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. Raking and blowing leaves into the street in the City of Mount Clemens is prohibited. All leaves must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.

Absolutely no raking or blowing leaves into the street. If you have a landscaping company, please make sure that they are aware

of this policy. Your complete cooperation will be appreciated.

The city will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The city will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the Fall season.

A city contracted yard waste collection truck will operate through December 10, 2021 only. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be picked up. Brush piles and yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Place all yard waste at curbside no

earlier than 6 p.m. the day before your scheduled pick up day and no later than 7:00a.m.. of your scheduled pick up day.

Please remember that following city policy will not only be appreciated by the City of Mount Clemens, but also by your neighbor who has been taking the time to bag their leaves.

The next election in the City of Mount Clemens is Tuesday, August 3, 2021 for the following race:

State Senator 8th District - Partial Term Ending 01/01/2023

Because this is a primary election for the purpose of selecting one Democrat candidate and one Republication candidate for the November 2, 2021 election, you may only vote for one candidate total. This will be the only contest on the ballot for this election.

Voting precincts will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

The last day to register to vote in the August 3, 2021 election in any manner other than in-person with the city clerk's office is July 19, 2021.

Please note that Precinct #2 (normally located at the Wilson Gym, 58 South

Unsung Heroes

Its not unusual to hear a news story or read an article about a firefiahter performing heroic acts or kind deeds. While all of this is true, there is a hero that never gets much of the credit. The one I am speaking of is the firefiahter's spouse. They are the ones that are holding things together on the home front while their firefighter is away. Many fire fighters work 24-hour shifts. These shifts include holidays and weekends. Firefighters are also very busy on their days off filling in for firefighters who are off on leave time. They also spend a lot of off duty time going to training classes. Many departments also have their personnel respond off-duty night and day to assist with emergencies that are too large or complex for their on-duty staffing. That does not leave much time for at home activities. When there is a break, the firefighter is usually tired from lack of sleep or stress from the job. This leaves the spouse to handle everything alone most of the time. The kids, the pets, the home, the bills, all the problems fall on the spouse. FIRE DEPT.

All residents should have received their 2021 Summer Tax Bill. If your taxes are paid by your mortgage company, please keep this for your records. Summer taxes are due by September 15, 2021. If you are unable to pay the entire amount due, you may make payments toward your balance at any time, starting July 1st. We do not make payment arrangements on taxes. If paying in person, we will issue you a receipt with your remaining balance due. After September 15th, a 4% flat penalty will be added to any remaining balance. This amount will not be penalized again until March 1, 2022, when it is turned over to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office. If you have any questions, please contact the Treasurer's Office at 586-469-6818 x 2.

Senior Deferments for Taxes

If you are 62 or over before December 31, 2021, (or you are permanently disabled) and your income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed \$40,000, you are eligible to apply for a deferment of your summer property taxes. This form must be filled out and signed each year between July 1st and September 15th) and will give you until February 28, 2022 to pay your summer taxes without penalty.
