This edition of the Clementimes Newsletter marks the one-year anniversary of our collaboration with the Mount Clemens Public Library to bring the residents a new and improved publication. You may have noticed the delay in the construction of the Downtown Revitalization Project. In mid-May the City administration was notified of further requirements for our federal funding. These requirements must be met before construction can begin. We are working diligently to meet those requirements and anticipate a new start date of March 2025.

In April the commission approved a contract with Rent Fun LLC. The City will soon be offering self-service kayak rentals and lockers. Users will be able to rent a kayak at MacArthur Park or Shadyside Park and then drop in at the kayak launch. MacArthur Park has a barrier free kayak launch making getting in and out of the kayak much easier.

In June your City Commissioners approved our 2024-2025 budget. Some of the highlights of this budget include appropriations for much-needed road projects, outdoor play equipment at Cairns Community Center, and a downtown sidewalk project. For more information on the budget, please see the City's website.

The Macomb County Chamber presents the Mount Clemens State of the City address on October 25, 2024 at the historic Emerald Theater. Tickets are \$35 and can be purchased at www.macombcountychamber.com. If you are unable to attend the October 25th event, check our City website or social media for updates on where to view the recording.

November 5, 2024 the City will conduct our Presidential elections.



- Thursday, September 26, 2024 Absentee ballots available for voters.
- Monday, October 21, 2024 Last day to register in any manner other than in-person at the city clerk's office for the November 5, 2024 election.
- Monday, October 21, 2024 Public accuracy test of voting equipment at 9:00 a.m. at Mount Clemens City Hall.
- Saturday, October 26, 2024 Early voting begins at Mount Clemens City Hall from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. daily (including weekends) through Sunday, November 3, 2024.
- Friday, November 1, 2024 Last day to have an absentee ballot mailed to a voter.
- Monday, November 4, 2024 Last day to obtain an absentee ballot in person at city clerk's office by 4:00 p.m.

Tuesday, November 5, 2024 – Election Day. Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

HOLIDAY REFUSE CALENDAR

Labor Day - Monday, September 2, 2024

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 2nd. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 2nd, through Friday, September 6th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 9, 2024.

Columbus Day – Monday, October 14, 2024

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire month of October.

Veteran's Day – Monday, November 11, 2024

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during Veteran's Day week - November 11th through November 15th.

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 28, 2024

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 28th. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 29th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 30th. Garbage pickup for Monday, November 25th, Tuesday, November 26th, and Wednesday, November 27th will be **on schedule**.

COMPOST/LEAF PICKUP SEASON ENDS DECEMBER 6TH

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. RAKING AND BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS PROHIBITED. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees MUST be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.

A City contracted yard waste collection truck will operate through December 6, 2024 only. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste. YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. Brush piles and yard waste MUST be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers marked "COMPOST" or "YARD WASTE" that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Place all yard waste at curbside no earlier than 6 p.m. the day before your scheduled pick up day and **NO LATER THAN 7:00 A.M.** of your scheduled pick up day.

ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY.

Please remember that following City policy will not only be appreciated by the City of Mount Clemens, but also by your neighbor who has been taking the time to bag their leaves.

The City will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The City will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the fall season.

EMAIL & SMS NOTIFICATIONS



Residents who want to stay up to date on what is happening in Mount Clemens are encouraged to sign up for email notifications, SMS notifications, or both. There are two types of notifications- alert and newsletter. Alerts only go out during events like water main breaks, traffic detours, road closures and severe weather. A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF REYNOLDS

Good Day Mount Clemens,

As we approach the fall season I wanted to share with you some fall safety tips. However, these tips will be about the other type of fall.

Did you know that 1 in 3 older adults will experience a fall, and around 5% of those will require treatment in the emergency room? Some of these injuries can be significant and life altering. The good news is that there are a few things you can do to minimize your risk of falling:

1. Exercise Regularly.

Exercise will help you build strength and improve your balance and coordination. Ask your doctor about the best physical exercise for you.

2. Take your time.

Get out of chairs slowly. Sit a moment before you get out of your bed. Stand and get your balance before you walk. Be aware of your surroundings.

3. Keep stairs, pathways, and walking areas clear.

Remove electrical cords, shoes, clothing, books, magazines, and other items that may be in the way of foot traffic. Have easy-to-grip handrails installed along the full length on both sides of the stairs. Consider subscribing to a medical alert system. If you have an emergency, just push the wearable button that is provided and the service will send emergency responders.

4. Improve the lighting in and outside your home.

Use night lights or a flashlight to light the path between your bedroom and the bathroom. Turn on the lights before using the stairs. Have lighting at both the top and bottom of stairways. See an eye doctor once a year.

5. Use non-slip mats and grab bars.

Non-slip mats increase safety in the bathtub and on shower floors. Use non-slip mats outside the tub and shower. Install grab bars on the wall next to the bathtub, shower, and toilet. Wipe up spilled liquids immediately.

6. Be aware of uneven surfaces.

Make sure indoor flooring is safe from tripping hazards. Use only throw rugs that have rubber, non-skid backing. Consider non-skid pads under rugs. Always smooth out wrinkles and folds in carpeting. Be aware of uneven sidewalks and pavement outdoors. Ask a family member, a friend, or a neighbor to clear ice and snow from outdoor stairs and walkways. Always use handrails, if available, and step carefully.

7. Wear sturdy, well-fitting shoes.

Low-heeled shoes with non-slip soles are best, even inside. These are safer than high heels, thick soled athletic shoes, slippers, or stocking feet.

I would also like to remind you that having an up-to -date list of your medications is very important to First Responders and the Emergency Department; Stick it on your fridge or in your wallet, just in case it's ever needed!

Practicing these safety tips will greatly reduce the chances of a fall and the potential injury that can come from a fall. Be on the lookout for trip/fall hazards Mount Clemens, so you and your loved ones can have a safe fall of 2024!




According to many studies, 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys experience some form of sexual abuse or exploitation before they turn 18. Half of child victims will wait at least 5 years before telling.

One reason that child sexual abuse is so common is because people generally don't want to talk about it. However, the more we talk about it, the safer kids actually become!

Care House offers an age-appropriate program called ROAR that starts the conversation with children about body safety and how to identify safe people to tell if uncomfortable touches occur. Parents receive materials to continue the conversation at home.

Any organization serving kids ages four through eight, such as elementary schools, preschools, daycare centers and after-school programs, are eligible to schedule a ROAR presentation at no cost by contacting Erica McLaughlin, Care House Outreach and Prevention Coordinator at 586.463.0123 or by email at EricaM@mccarehouse.org









Effective January 1, 2024, many companies in the United States must report information about their beneficial owners, the individuals who ultimately own or control the company, to the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN), a bureau of the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Your company may need to report information about its beneficial owners if it is: 1. a corporation, a limited liability company (LLC), or was otherwise created in the United States by filing a document with a secretary of state or any similar office under the law of a state or Indian tribe; or 2. a foreign company and was registered to do business in any U.S. state or Indian tribe by such a filing.



UNDERSTANDING THE NUMBERS

Average Sale Price – Good: While the increase in average price decreases affordability, that we saw an increase while at the same time rates remained high and inventory increased demonstrates a strong market and value of homeownership. While affordability for some is a problem, those able to buy, but waiting for lower rates are missing making a mistake. The increase in inventory also will require sellers to be more realistic regarding both price and condition. Homes poorly priced or in need of repair, will give buyers negotiating power.

Days on Market (DOM) – Healthy: A DOM of under 30 days indicates there is strong buyer interest, but there is also some opportunity for buyers not to be rushed.

Inventory – Improving: Despite many sellers having low rates, life continues to motivate sellers to move. The increase in inventory both year over year and quarter over quarter is good news.

Absorption Rate – Seller's market: Buyers need to remain aggressive when they find a home they really want. An absorption rate at these levels means the market is very competitive from a buyer's perspective.

INTEREST RATES FOR MORTGAGES VARY

As of mid-2024 in the United States, interest rates for different types of mortgages vary:


