

MAYOR'S UPDATE:

Can you believe we are rounding the halfway point of 2024? For me it feels like the first six months were packed with planning and preparing for the upcoming projects. Our team has been working on: Grand Street Water Main Replacement, District 11 Sidewalk Replacements, Gate Valve Turning Program, Wastewater Treatment Plant Septic Receiving Station Upgrade, Open Cut Sewer Repair Program, Pipe



Bursting Sewer Repair, The Downtown Revitalization Project, The New Street Parking Lot Replacement, Installation of Cairns Playground, Hubbard Street Reconstruction and Concrete Patching, Sanitary Sewer Lining, and Local and Major Streets Repair Program. All of these programs and projects are coordinated through collaboration and hours of meetings and are finally ready to begin! At the time of this publication, the Downtown Revitalization project will have broken ground beginning with Macomb Place and the Cherry Street Mall portion of the project. The New Street Parking Lot will begin in late fall of 2024. Later in this edition of the Clementimes you can find additional details of each of the projects and programs from our staff.

Often, I get the question from residents "how can I help to support Mount Clemens". One important way residents can contribute to our success is by increasing the frequency they use our downtown businesses during this construction. Construction projects, whether at your home or in a commercial area, can be inconvenient. We ask that you pardon our dust and still come patronize our terrific businesses.

Our Great Lakes Water Connection project is in full swing going out to bid this past May. The construction is expected to break ground in mid-summer and continue through 2028. This project will impact several different areas of the City throughout the months of construction. I hope this summer you find time to make memories with your family, enjoy a sunny day and take a stroll at one of our beautiful parks!

IMPORTANT DATES FOR THE AUGUST 6, 2024 PRIMARY ELECTION

- Thursday, June 27, 2024 Absent voter ballots available for voters.
- Monday, July 22, 2024 Last day to register in any manner other than in-person at the city clerk's office for the August 6, 2024 election.
- Monday, July 22, 2024 Public accuracy test of voting equipment at 9:00 a.m.
- Saturday, July 27, 2024 Early voting begins at Mount Clemens City Hall from 8:30 a.m. 4:30 p.m. daily (including weekends) through Sunday, August 4, 2024.
- Friday, August 2, 2024 Last day to have an absentee ballot mailed to a voter.
- Monday, August 5, 2024 Last day to obtain an absentee ballot (in person at city clerk's office) by 4:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, August 6, 2024 Election Day. Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

SKIP THE CROWDS AND VOTE EARLY THIS YEAR!

Mount Clemens voters are invited to cast their ballot early for the August 6, 2024 primary election. Early voting begins on Saturday, July 27th and continues for nine consecutive days (including weekends) through Sunday, August 4th from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. at Mount Clemens City Hall.

WHY DID I RECEIVE A VOTER REGISTRATION FORM IN THE MAIL?

Residents who receive unsolicited voter registration materials by mail should be aware that it did not come from the Mount Clemens city clerk's office. Such forms are sent by political parties and public interest groups who have no knowledge of voters' registration statuses.

Once a resident is registered to vote in the city, there is no reason to re-register and all unsolicited voter registration forms should be discarded. The city clerk's office will only send a resident a voter registration form upon request.

Voters may always check their registration status by contacting the city clerk's office, or by visiting www.mi.gov/vote online.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

2024 CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

1. Grand Water Main Replacement – Southbound Gratiot to N Wilson Boulevard

Approximately 2,700 feet of 8-inch water main will be replaced along Grand Avenue between Southbound Gratiot Avenue and N Wilson Blvd. This will bring improvements to the water quality and overall efficiency of the water distribution system. Construction should be completed by the end of December 2024. Pavement replacement will take place in 2025.

2. District 11 Sidewalks - Various locations

The City is continuing its sidewalk program this year with District 11 scheduled to begin in April. District 11 will have hazardous and defective concrete sidewalks removed and replaced.

3. Gate Valve Turning Program

Gate valves, a key component of the drinking water distribution system will be inspected, evaluated and exercised to ensure they are in proper working order. This program will be performed across the entire City.

4. Wastewater Treatment Plant Septic Receiving Station

The City is replacing and upgrading its septic waste receiving station at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. These upgrades will allow the City to continue to provide septic sewage treatment and protect the treatment plant.

5. Open Cut Sewer Repair – Various Locations

The City was awarded federal funding through the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan program. This project will include performing sanitary sewer repairs by the method of open cut at various locations throughout the City. Work will begin in Spring 2024 and is to be substantially completed by December 2024.

6. Pipe Bursting Sewer Repairs - Various locations

The City was awarded federal funding through the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan program. This project will include performing sanitary sewer repairs by the method of pipe bursting at various locations throughout the City. Work will begin in Spring 2024 and is to be substantially completed by November 2024.

7. Downtown Revitalization - Macomb Place, Cherry Street Mall and Cherry Street

The City's Downtown will be revitalized and turned into a walkable plaza. Improvements include increasing the area's walkability with pedestrian corridors along Macomb Place and Cherry Street, underground infrastructure replacement, fountain stage replacement and site amenity upgrades.

8. New Street Parking Lot

Located at the intersection of New Street and Pine Street, the New Street parking lot will be reconstructed. Improvements include a streamlined entrance and exit, replacement of pavement and storm sewers, relocation of trash bins into an enclosure, EV parking spots and new parking payment kiosks. Work will begin late Summer 2024.

9. Cairns Playground - Cairns Community Center

A new playground will be installed behind Cairns Community Center. The playground equipment, benches, and a concrete pathway connecting the parking lot to the playground will be completed by December 2024.

10. Hubbard Street Reconstruction and Concrete Patching

The City received federal funding through the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to perform concrete pavement rehabilitation on Hubbard Street from North Groesbeck Highway to the Canadian National Railroad tracks. Hubbard Street will be reconstructed from North Groesbeck Highway to North Rose Street. Hubbard Street will have concrete pavement patching performed from N Rose Street to the Canadian National Railroad tracks.

11. Alter Court Watermain Replacement and Looping

Alter Court will have the watermain replaced from Groesbeck Highway west to the City limits. The watermain will then be looped north to Roseview Blvd and Ellwood Street. The looping of the watermain increases the water quality, water pressure and provides resiliency to the overall drinking system.

12. Sanitary Sewer Lining Repairs

Sanitary sewer repairs will occur throughout the City using a method of repair that lines the pipe with a cured-in-place-pipe liner. This is a cost-effective repair method that reduces the amount of resident disturbance and does not require excavation to occur.

13. Local Street Repairs

Repairs of local streets will occur at various locations throughout the City. These areas were evaluated using an engineered scoring system that considered the streets road condition rating, length of repair area, volume of usage and previous repair history.

14. Major Street Repairs

Repairs of major streets will occur at various locations throughout the City. These areas were evaluated using an engineered scoring system that considered the streets road condition rating, length of repair area, volume of usage and previous repair history.

HOLIDAY REFUSE CALENDAR

Independence Day – Thursday, July 4, 2024

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, July 4th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Thursday, July 4th through Friday, July 5th. Garbage pickup for Monday, July 1st, and Tuesday, July 2nd, and Wednesday July 3rd will be picked up *on schedule*.

Labor Day - Monday, September 2, 2024

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 2nd. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 2nd, through Friday, September 6th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 9, 2024.

LEAF PICKUP POLICY

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. RAKING AND BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS PROHIBITED. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees <u>MUST</u> be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.



ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY. YOUR COMPLETE COOPERATION WILL BE APPRECIATED.

The City will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The City will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the Fall season.

A City contracted yard waste collection truck will operate on your garbage day. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste. YARD WASTE IN

PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. Brush piles and yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers marked "COMPOST" or "YARD WASTE" that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Place all yard waste at curbside no earlier than 6 p.m. the day before your scheduled pick up day and **NO LATER THAN**7:00 A.M. of your scheduled pick up day.

Please remember that following City policy will not only be appreciated by the City of Mount Clemens, but also by your neighbor who has been taking the time to bag their leaves.

A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF REYNOLDS

Good Day Mount Clemens,


Summer is almost here and I'm confident that we are all anxious to enjoy some nice weather and outdoor activities now that winter is gone. There's nothing like a campfire on a summer night. I wanted to provide you with some Outdoor Fire Safety tips and remind you of the local Fire Ordinances here in Mount Clemens. Whether you're at home in your backyard or at your favorite campsite there are some important facts you need to know:

Chimineas and outdoor fireplaces may be used in Mount Clemens, so long as you strictly adhere to the following:

- Rubbish, of any kind, may not be burned.
- The smoke from the fire may not be offensive or objectional; Clean, dry, untreated, natural wood such as logs are best.
- Construction grade lumber will <u>likely</u> violate the local ordinance and cause the Fire Department to order your fire to be extinguished.

"Open burning" or ground-based fires, such as a Camp Fire, have additional requirements as they are not contained and could more easily spread:

- The Fire may not exceed 6 square feet in total area.
- Rubbish, of any kind, may not be burned.
- There may be no objectional or offensive smoke odors.
- The fire must be at least 25 feet from any structure.
- The fire must be constantly attended, and a means of extinguishment must be readily available at all times.



Additionally, I cannot overemphasize the importance of **NEVER** using Gasoline or other combustible/flammable liquids as a starter or accelerant for your outdoor fire. **Gasoline fumes are highly volatile and can cause a deadly accident in an instant**.

Please exercise great caution and consideration for your neighbors. The Mount Clemens Fire Department wishes all of our residents a fun, and safe, summer of 2024!!


SUMMER FUN IN THE SUN IN DOWNTOWN MOUNT CLEMENS

TREASURER'S OFFICE

SUMMER TAX BILLS

All residents will receive their 2024 Summer Tax Bill around July 1st. If your taxes are paid by your mortgage company, please keep this for your records. Summer taxes are due by September 16, 2024. If you are unable to pay the entire amount due, you may make payments toward your balance at any time, starting July 1st. We do not make payment arrangements on taxes. If paying in person, we will issue you a receipt with your remaining balance due. After September 16th, a 4% flat penalty will be added to any remaining balance. This amount will not be penalized again until March 1, 2025, when it is turned over to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office. DELINQUENT TRANSFER TO TAX FEE

Any delinquent bill that is moved onto the property taxes will incur a 15% fee. *This fee will not apply to sidewalk invoices.*

SENIOR DEFERMENTS FOR TAXES

If you are 62 or over before December 31, 2024, (or you are permanently disabled) and your income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed \$40,000, you are eligible to apply for a deferment of your homestead summer property taxes. This form must be filled out and signed <u>each year</u> between July 1st and September 15th and will give you until February 28, 2025 to pay your summer taxes without

penalty. If you have any questions or wish to obtain a form by mail, please contact the Treasurer's Office at (586) 469-6800 x2.



DELINQUENT WATER BILLS

Due to implementation of monthly water billing over a year ago, past due notices are no longer sent out. <u>Water shut offs are conducted on or after the 3rd Tuesday of each month</u>. Please be mindful of your water balance and contact the Treasurer's Office for payment arrangements, if necessary. If you need assistance paying your bill, call 211 for available options.

RIVERFRONT GAZEBO

Our beautiful riverfront gazebo is available to rent for weddings, pictures, etc. You can contact the Treasurer's office at 586-469-6800 ext 2 to inquire about reserving it. The cost is \$50/first hour and \$25/any additional hours.





MOUNT CLEMENS STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN

The collection of storm water is an important responsibility of the City of Mount Clemens. The City maintains storm sewer infrastructure ranging from local street drainage to large diameter collection pipes. In Mount Clemens most storm water is collected in catch basins and makes its way into the Clinton River. The City also maintains storm water outfalls to the Clinton River and Greiner Drain. These surface water discharges are permitted by the State of Michigan by a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Storm Water permit.

How can you help?

- 1. Never sweep or blow leaves into a storm drain.
- 2. Use proper methods to dispose or recycle leaves.
- 3. Take used oil to a certified used oil collection center.
- 4. Follow directions on pesticides and fertilizers and avoid application when rain is forecasted.
- 5. Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly to keep bacteria and parasites out of our groundwater and lakes.

The City of Mount Clemens partners with the Clinton River Watershed Council (CWRC) to provide stormwater education opportunities to the public. CRWC provides community programming, k-12 education, citizen-science programs, educational resources, stewardship events, and more as part of the Stormwater Education Program. 




