As we enter the holiday season, I would love to share good news with you. Thanks to our State Delegation, State Representative Denise Mentzer and State Senator Kevin Hertel, the State of Michigan issued three generous appropriations totaling 8.5 million dollars. The first appropriation of 5 million dollars is for the demolition and remediation of the former Victory



Inn site. The second appropriation of two million dollars is allocated towards riverfront revitalization. The third will be used for the build out of our Septic Receiving Station at the wastewater treatment plant. All of these appropriations have significant implications for the city. The first having significant potential for future economic development of that property and corner of the city. The second alleviating strain on the city's general fund to pay for projects that would otherwise never be affordable.

Over the past quarter your city commission has been busy attending events like the Anton Art Party, State of Mount Clemens address, the Martha T. Berry fall fundraiser, Macomb Habitat for Humanity Gala, and the Grand Opening of the Cairns Community Center playground. Issues your city commissioners have worked on is the approval of the 24-25 Mount Clemens Strategic Plan (see the plan at the City's website www.mountclemens.gov). The commission also approved a parking study to be conducted in the next six months. This study is intended to evaluate our current parking system and parking lots. This will give insight into what the commission's priorities should be for the foreseeable future in parking and our parking lots.

On behalf of the City Commissioners and City of Mount Clemens staff members, I wish you and your family a happy, healthy and prosperous 2025!

NOVEMBER 4, 2025 CITY ELECTION: CALL FOR CANDIDATES

Application materials will be available in the city clerk's office in March 2025 for the following November 4, 2025 city election races:

Mayor – One (1) to be elected for a 2-year term

City Commission – Three (3) to be elected for a 4-year term

To qualify as a candidate, you must be:

- At least 18 years of age.
- A registered voter.
- A resident of the city for at least 365 days immediately prior to the last day of filing for office.

SIDEWALK SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL



Now that we are in the middle of another winter season here in Michigan, it is important to consider the removal of ice and snow from our sidewalks. As a very walkable community, with an extended network of sidewalks, it is critical that residents and businesses do their part to keep the sidewalks clear of snow and ice for both safety and quality of life concerns.

City ordinances require that "The occupant of any premises, or the owner of any unoccupied premises, is required to keep the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to such premises cleared, so far as is practicable and reasonable, from snow and ice to facilitate pedestrian use. Where there are no sidewalks, the occupant or owner shall clear a path free from snow and ice where a sidewalk would otherwise be, to facilitate pedestrian use. Whenever any snow or ice has fallen or accumulated, it shall be cleared within 12 hours after it has fallen or accumulated."

Failure to remove the snow and ice accordingly may result in the City issuing a violation notice or performing the task and billing the responsible property owner. We all hope this winter season is not a harsh one, but in the event that it is, the city thanks you in advance for your diligence in keeping the sidewalks of Mount Clemens safe.


A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF REYNOLDS

Good Day Mount Clemens,

As winter is fast approaching, I feel it is important we communicate some winter fire safety tips. Did you know that each year there are 1,900 fatalities and over 8,000 injuries in the US from residential fires that occur **during the winter months alone**, with "Heating equipment" as the number One cause? Let's talk about a few measures you can take to reduce the risk to you and your family.

- Keep anything combustible a minimum of 3 feet from a heating source; such as a Fireplace, Wood Stove, Space heater, etc.
- If you have a fireplace, be sure to have it inspected. Creosote can build up and be the source of a fire. Cracks in the flue can also lead to a fire. Only a qualified professional can do a proper inspection.
- Do not overload electrical outlets; overloaded circuits can short-out and start a fire.
- If you enjoy a real Christmas Tree, it must be kept always watered. Dry Christmas Trees can become incredibly dangerous and create a fast-moving fire in your home.

Also, please remember that your stove/oven is NOT designed to heat your home and can create some serious fire risks. If you need assistance with home heating costs, please reach out to **THAW**, The Heat and Warmth Fund at **1-800-866-8429**. They may be able to provide you some assistance.



Please use these tips to ensure you and your family have safety as a priority. The Mount Clemens Fire Department wishes you all a happy and safe winter season!

HOLIDAY REFUSE CALENDAR

Christmas Day – Wednesday, December 25, 2024

There will be NO garbage pickup on Wednesday, December 25th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Wednesday, December 25th through Friday, December 27th. Garbage pickup for Monday, December 23rd and Tuesday, December 24th will be picked up *on schedule*.

Christmas Tree Pickup

Christmas trees can be placed at the curb with your regular garbage. Please make sure that trees are bare and not in a plastic bag when placed at the curb.

COMPOST/LEAF PICKUP SEASON ENDS DECEMBER 6TH

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees MUST be placed in 30 gallon paper waste bags or 32 gallon or smaller refuse containers marked "compost" or "yard waste".

ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY. YOUR COMPLETE COOPERATION WILL BE APPRECIATED.

Winter Snow Removal

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the City may declare a "Snow Emergency" per City of Mount Clemens Ordinance #30.030. Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Vehicles not removed from the streets during a Snow Emergency may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, or the Snow Emergency has been terminated, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

Presidents Day – Monday, February 17, 2025

Garbage pickup will be *on schedule* during the entire month of February.

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 26th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, May 26th through Friday, May 30th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 2, 2025.

Independence Day – Friday, July 4, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Friday ONLY, July 4th. Friday's pickup will be on Saturday, July 5th. Garbage pickup for Monday, June 30th through Thursday, July 3rd, will be picked up *on schedule*.

Labor Day - Monday, September 1, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 1st. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 1st, through Friday, September 5th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 8, 2025.

Columbus Day – Monday, October 13, 2025

Garbage pickup will run *on schedule* during the entire month of October.

Veteran's Day – Tuesday, November 11, 2025

Garbage pickup will run *on schedule* during Veteran's Day week - November 10th through November 14th.

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 27, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 27th. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 28th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 29th. Garbage pickup for Monday, November 24th through Wednesday, November 26th will be *on schedule*.

Christmas Day - Thursday, December 25, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, December 25th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule on Thursday, December 25th and Friday, December 26th. Garbage pickup for Monday, December 22nd through Wednesday, December 24th will be picked up *on schedule*.



WINTER TAX BILLS

Residents should receive a winter tax bill in the mail around December 1, 2024, and it is due by February 28, 2025. Any 2024 tax amount that remains unpaid after that date will be transferred to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office for collection. You may call their office at 586-469-5190 for more information.

EVERY RESIDENT RECEIVES A TAX BILL, EVEN IF YOUR TAXES ARE PAID BY A MORTGAGE COMPANY. PLEASE KEEP THIS TAX BILL FOR INCOME TAX PURPOSES.

2025 DOG/CAT LICENSES

You may purchase 2025 animal licenses in the Treasurer's Office starting January 2, 2025. All renewals must be made during the months of January and February, or a penalty will apply. Please bring the rabies certificate that is signed by the veterinarian. The fees are: \$8.00/neutered and \$15.00/not neutered. All renewals after February 28th will include a \$10 penalty.

DELINQUENT TRANSFER TO TAX FEE

Any delinquent bill that is moved onto the property taxes will incur a 15% fee. *This fee will not apply to sidewalk invoices.*

FREE OPTION FOR PAYING WATER BILLS – AUTO PAY

The Treasurer's Office now offers an option to pay your water bill by ACH check for no fee. You will be required to fill out a form in our office, providing your routing and bank account information. MOUNT CLEMENS STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN

The collection of storm water is an important responsibility of the City of Mount Clemens. The City maintains storm sewer infrastructure ranging from local street drainage to large diameter collection pipes. In Mount Clemens most storm water is collected in catch basins and makes its way into the Clinton River. The City also maintains storm water outfalls to the Clinton River and Greiner Drain. These surface water discharges are permitted by the State of Michigan by a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Storm Water permit.

The Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) for the City of Mount Clemens is available on the City's website for public comment.



As we come to the end of 2024 in the United States, interest rates for different types of mortgages vary:

Conventional loans typically offer interest rates between 5.99% to 6.99% for 30-year fixed-rate mortgages, requiring a down payment of 3% to 20%. Private mortgage insurance (PMI) may be required if the down payment is less than 20%.

FHA loans, insured by the Federal Housing Administration, have rates ranging from 5.5% to 6.5%. They require a minimum down payment of 3.5% and include upfront and annual mortgage insurance premiums.

VA loans, guaranteed by the Department of Veterans Affairs, feature competitive rates of about 5.5% to 6.5% with no down payment requirement. They may include a one-time funding fee, which can be financed into the loan.

These rates are influenced by economic conditions and lender policies, which directly impact how affordable buying a home can be. UNDERSTANDING THE NUMBERS

Average Sale Price – Good: Prices continue to climb modestly from the previous quarter with the decline from a year ago attributable to a larger percentage of homes for sale being over \$250,000 in 2023 than in 2024. The rise in prices helps those owning homes to increase net worth, but at 2.7% the increase is offset by the reduction in interest rates.

Days on Market (DOM) - Brisk: At just over two weeks, good homes sell quickly and buyers need to be decisive when they see a home they like.

Inventory – Improving: While this increases competition for sellers, it increases opportunity for buyers. Because there are still more buyers for houses than there are houses for sale, this competition is not creating any downward pressure on prices.

Absorption Rate – Seller's market: The absorption rate continues to move downward to the buyers advantage, but sellers are still in control of negotiating all other factors considered.

NEW EMPLOYEMNT LAWS TAKING EFFECT EARLY 2025



The following *minimum wage* and sick leave laws will take effect in Michigan in early 2025.

On January 1st minimum wage will increase to \$10.56 per hour. Less than two months later, on February 21 the minimum wage will increase again to \$12.48 per hour. The minimum base wage for tipped employees will be \$4.01 per hour on January 1 and \$5.99 on February 21. *Minimum wage for minors* will increase to \$8.98 on January 1 and \$10.61 on February 21.

Beginning on February 21, Michigan's Earned Sick Time Act requires employers of all sizes provide paid earned sick time (EST) to all Michigan employees. Employees will accrue sick time at a rate of one hour for every 30 hours worked. Businesses with 10+ employees must allow at least 72 hours of paid sick time per year to be used to the extent the leave is accrued. Businesses with fewer than 10 employees must allow at least 40 hours of paid sick time annually, plus an additional 32 hours of unpaid sick time to the extent leave is accrued. Unused sick time can be carried over, but employers may limit annual use to no more than 72 hours. 
