

NO KNOCK LIST

Like it or not, spring is the time when door-to-door solicitors descend upon neighborhoods. In order to protect our residents from these unwanted interruptions, the Mount Clemens city clerk's office maintains a residential No-Knock List. This list is given to all solicitors upon issuance of a solicitation permit and prohibits them from approaching all addresses on the list.



Door-to-door solicitation is permitted in Mount Clemens; however, all solicitors must be licensed by the city and possess a valid solicitor's license from the city clerk's office. Exempt from the license requirement are children, religious organizations and candidates running for office. Licensed door-to-door solicitors are only permitted to call on residences between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Residents are advised not to provide any information to door-to-door solicitors, such as copies of utility or phone bills. Account numbers can be lifted from these documents and unauthorized switching of companies can occur. Please contact the Macomb County Sheriff's Office at 586.469.5151 for complaints about solicitors.

THE NEXT ELECTION IN MOUNT CLEMENS IS TUESDAY, MAY 6, 2025

On Tuesday, May 6, 2025, Mount Clemens voters will be asked to decide if the Mount Clemens Community School District shall borrow the sum of not to exceed \$91,820,000 and issue its unlimited tax general obligation bonds for the purpose of defraying all or part of the cost of building improvements and technology upgrades for the district.

Voting precincts will be open on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

NOVEMBER 4, 2025 CITY ELECTION: CALL FOR CANDIDATES

Application materials will be available in the city clerk's office in March 2025 for the following November 4, 2025 city election races:

Mayor – One (1) to be elected for a 2-year term

City Commission – Three (3) to be elected for a 4-year term



To qualify as a candidate, you must be:

- At least 18 years of age.
- A registered voter.
- A resident of the city for at least 365 days immediately prior to the last day of filing for office.

The deadline for application materials is Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. in the Mount Clemens city clerk's office.

2024 PROPERTY TAXES

All 2024 property taxes with balances remaining have been transferred to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office for collection. Payments must be made to: Macomb County Treasurer, 1 S. The 2025 summer property taxes will be payable from July 1 – September 15, 2025.

MOUNT CLEMENS STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN

The collection of storm water is an important responsibility of the City of Mount Clemens. The City maintains storm sewer infrastructure ranging from local street drainage to large diameter collection pipes. In Mount Clemens most storm water is collected in catch basins and makes its way into the Clinton River. The City also maintains storm water outfalls to the Clinton River and Greiner Drain. These surface water discharges are permitted by the State of Michigan by a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Storm Water permit.

The Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) for the City of Mount Clemens is available on the City's website for public comment.

A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF REYNOLDS


Good day all and welcome to Spring of 2025 from the Mount Clemens Fire Department. Spring is a time for spring cleaning, and I want to share some cleaning tips with you that will make your home more fire safe!

Tip # 1: Clear your Stovetop of fire hazards

- Keep stovetop clean between cooking meals: Grease and cooking oils are flammable
- Do not leave flammables on the stovetop: oven mitts, utensils, kitchen towels, paper towels, etc.
- Turn pot handles inward to prevent spills which could cause scalding and burns
- Always stay attentive to the kitchen when cooking: Cooking is the number one cause of home fires and home fire injuries

Tip # 2: Clean the lint trap in your dryer

- Remove lint before and after each load
- Make sure the exhaust vent is clear of lint build up and make sure the outside vent louver opens when the dryer is running
- Do not store flammable items such as cardboard and cleaning supplies on or near the dryer



- Check for frayed or damaged electrical cords; remove or replace any damaged cords
- Ensure that extension cords do not run under rugs or carpeting
- Take care to not overload any circuits; if the breaker "trips" or a fuse "blows" there is likely too much plugged in

Tip #4: Unclutter the garage

- Dispose of oily/greasy rags: never leave in a pile they can spontaneously ignite!
- Remove old newspapers, boxes, blankets and other combustibles that may be piling up
- Store propane and gasoline in a detached shed or detached garage
- Check lawn equipment for fuel leaks

Tip # 5: Be Prepared

- Test smoke alarms twice a year when we change the clocks
- Have a smoke detector on every floor of your home
- Create an escape plan and practice it with your family

Following these simple safety tips can prevent a fire in your home. The Mount Clemens Fire Department has smoke detectors available for Mount Clemens residents with a need; Simply stop by the Fire Department and we will assist you with a fire safe plan.

EXCITING THINGS ARE HAPPENING DOWNTOWN



2025 HOLIDAY GARBAGE PICKUP SCHEDULE

Good Friday – Friday, April 18, 2025

Garbage pickup will be **on schedule** during the entire month of April.

Memorial Day – Monday, May 26, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 26th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, May 26th through Friday, May 30th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 2, 2025.

Independence Day – Friday, July 4, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Friday ONLY, July 4th. Friday's pickup will be on Saturday, July 5th. Garbage pickup for Monday, June 30th through Thursday, July 3rd, will be picked up *on schedule*.

Labor Day – Monday, September 1, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 1st. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 1st, through Friday, September 5th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 8, 2025.

Columbus Day – Monday, October 13, 2025

Garbage pickup will run *on schedule* during the entire month of October.

Veteran's Day – Tuesday, November 11, 2025

Garbage pickup will run **on schedule** during Veteran's Day week - November 10th through November 14th.

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 27, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 27th. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 28th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 29th. Garbage pickup for Monday, November 24th through Wednesday, November 26th will be *on schedule*.

Christmas Day - Thursday, December 25, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, December 25th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule on Thursday, December 25th and Friday, December 26th. Garbage pickup for Monday, December 22nd through Wednesday, December 24th will be picked up *on schedule*.

New Years Day – Thursday, January 1, 2026

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, January 1st. Pickup will run one day behind schedule on Thursday, January 1st and Friday, January 2nd. Garbage pickup for Monday, December 29th through Wednesday, December 31st, will be picked up on schedule. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, January 5, 2026.

Yard Waste

Yard waste pickup is schedued to begin MARCH 24, 2025

A special yard waste collection truck will operate in the City from March 24th through December 5th only.

NO COMPOST OR YARD WASTE WILL BE PICKED UP AFTER DECEMBER 5, 2025.

BEGINNING MARCH 24th:

Please do one of the three following things to eliminate yard waste:

- 1. Compost your yard waste at home.
- 2. Place all compost at the curb in a 32 gallon or smaller refuse container marked "COMPOST" or "YARD WASTE". these containers will not be emptied if they contain anything other than yard waste.
- 3. Place yard waste in large 30-gallon brown paper bags.

Compost must be placed at the curb for collection with your household refuse by 7 a.m. on your regular pickup day. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Brush must be cut into four feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds each or measure over 18" in diameter. Large logs over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up.

We recommend that residents comply with the City's composting guidelines to help with our efforts in keeping up with constantly changing environmental standards and still provide efficient and economical refuse collection service within the City of Mount Clemens.

PLEASE REMEMBER, RAKING LEAVES OR GRASS INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.


MacArthur Park




