We hope you like the bold new look for Clementimes. It's a small part of a much larger rebranding project for Mount Clemens and you'll be seeing other parts of it soon.

To create Mount Clemens' brand, we gathered input from over 1,100 Mount Clemens residents, business, and visitors as to how they perceived our city and how they wanted it to be perceived by others. History, diversity and potential were keywords often mentioned by survey respondents. Downtown Mount Clemens, the Clinton River, our art community and the wonderful people of our town were identified as our best assets and with the most potential to grow.

Our branding consultant, Redhead Creative Consultancy, incorporated the survey data into the development of Mount Clemens' new brand. They also created three taglines, a logo, an icon, a new city seal and a mascot. You can see the icon above as part of the new Clementimes masthead. Our new logo pays homage to the Clinton River, using a river symbol to cross the "t."


Winter Snow Removal & Snow Emergency Information

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snowstorm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the city has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the city may declare a "Snow Emergency". Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snowstorms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/ or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.



General Election - Tuesday, November 2, 2021

The next election in the City of Mount Clemens is Tuesday, November 2, 2021 for the following races:

State Senator 8th District – Partial Term Ending 01/01/2023

Mayor – One (1) to be elected for a 2-year term

City Commission – Three (3) to be elected for a 4-year term

In addition to the races, there will also be a proposed amendment to Section 10.211, Sec. 155 of Article 12 of the Mount Clemens City Charter pertaining to purchasing limits for city departments.

Absentee Ballot Drop Boxes

Mount Clemens voters now have two safe and secure drop box options in which to return their absentee ballots and applications. The indoor drop box is located on the first floor of city hall next to the treasurers office and is available during city office hours of Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The outdoor drive-up drop box can be found in the city hall parking lot across from the gazebo and is available for use 24 hours a day. This drop box provides voters with the added convenience of not having to come into city hall, or even getting out of their car.

Neither drop box requires postage and is the preferred method to return all election materials to the city clerk's office for every election.

Charter Amendment on November Ballot

When Mount Clemens voters go to the polls on November 2, 2021, they will be asked to approve a city charter amendment ballot question. The proposed amendment to Section 10.211 of the Mount Clemens City Charter would change the purchasing limit for city departments from \$1,500 to \$15,000 without having to prepare specifications and obtain formal bids.

Why are voters being asked to approve this city charter amendment?

The bid process can be a very time consuming and expensive procedure. The city commission put this question on the ballot because the administration believes that the current purchasing limit is actually increasing the cost of obtaining goods and services, while stalling progress on city projects. Employees and/or consultants must be paid to prepare specifications and to manage the bid opening and award process.

Responding to bid requests can also be a cumbersome and an expensive process for vendors. As a result, many vendors often elect not to respond to bid requests because they believe that the profit on a potential sale is not worth the time and effort necessary to prepare a formal bid. Because of this, the city sometimes ends up with very few or no bids. Some vendors even intentionally respond with a "high ball" bid, even more than the list price, in hopes of being the only bidder.

How does the proposed purchasing limit of \$15,000 compare to other municipalities?

While researching municipal purchasing limits, the administration discovered that most purchasing limits ranged from \$5,000-\$20,000. Some are even as high as \$50,000 before requiring the use of a bid process. The amount of \$15,000 was mutually agreed upon by city department heads as a reasonable number that will result in a more efficient and cost-effective procurement process.

How will the amendment ballot question be worded?

"The Mount Clemens City Charter was adopted in 1954 and contains some provisions that are outdated and no longer practical." One such provision requires sealed bids be obtained for all sales and purchases in excess of \$1,500.00. The Mount Clemens City Commission finds that it is necessary and in the best interest of the city to seek voter approval to raise said amount from \$1,500.00 to \$15,000.00, in order to adjust for inflation, expedite processing of invoices and receipts, as well as improving operational efficiency and economy.

An amendment to Section 10.211, Sec.155 of Article 12 of the city charter, to provide that sealed bids for all sales and purchases in excess of \$1,500.00, be increased to sealed bids for all sales and purchases in excess of \$15,000.00. Shall the proposed amendment be adopted?"
