There will be NO garbage pickup on Tuesday, January 1st. Pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Tuesday, January 1st through Friday, January 4th. Garbage pickup for Monday, December 31st will be on schedule.

### Winter Snow Removal & Snow Emergency Information

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the City may declare a "Snow Emergency". Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared

and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

### Compost/Leaf Pickup Season Ends December 7th

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees MUST be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers marked "compost" or "yard waste".

#### **Fire Prevention**

October is National Fire Prevention Month. In the upcoming weeks MCFD will be going to local schools to give fire safety talks and demonstrations. Some key points for fire prevention in your own home

- 1) Have an exit plan.
- 2) Establish a common meeting place outside the house.

3) Have functioning smoke detectors • Winter Tax Bills in every room, and outside of all sleeping areas. Make sure to test smoke detectors monthly and to change batteries at daylight savings time.

### Fire Safety Tip

As the weather changes more and more people are enjoying the you know that after you have a fire, the soot can become hard on the wall of your chimney and become flammable creosote over time? It's always recommended before each winter you plan on burning, to inspect or have someone inspect your chimney to see if it needs cleaning. In addition, always burn dry clean seasoned wood and never \_ up to make monthly payments to use flammable liquids to start your fire in the fireplace.

- 2. 24-Hour DROP BOX located on west side of City Hall parking lot, across from Gazebo, is available for you to place an envelope containing your remittance and a written check or money order payable to the City of Mount Clemens. Do not deposit cash.
- 3. PAY IN PERSON by going to City Hall Treasurer's Office. Cash, check or money order, credit/ debit card are accepted and a receipt will be issued. A processing fee applies to credit/ debit card payments. Office hours are 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM weekdays.
- 4. **PAY ONLINE** using MasterCard or Visa at City's website www. cityofmountclemens.com, click on the applicable link under Make Online Payments. A processing fee applies.
- 5. **PAY BY PHONE** by calling 866.789.5536 to pay by check, debit card or credit card. A processing fee applies.
