election! To make the process even easier, voters may request to be on the City's Permanent Absentee Voter List. By doing so, voters will be automatically mailed an application requesting an absentee ballot for every election.

our Mount Clemens residents is a priority for the City Clerk's Office and the department has instituted greater safeguards when it comes to door-to-door solicitors in the City. By working in conjunction with the Macomb County Sheriff's Department, requiring stricter background checks and denying access to our neighborhood porches during the holidays, we are trying to keep our residents as safe as possible. In order to grant residents even more control over who visits their homes, the Clerk's Office maintains a "No-Knock" List that contains the addresses of residents who do not wish to be disturbed by solicitors. Door-to-door solicitors are given the list when they pick up their solicitor's license and are prohibited from approaching any of the addresses on the list. Door decals are also

New Year's Day

There will be NO garbage pickup on Wednesday, January 1st. Pickup will run one day behind schedule beginning Wednesday, January 1st through Friday, January 3rd.
Garbage pickup for Monday, December 30th and Tuesday, December 31st will be picked up on schedule. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, January 6, 2020.

Winter Snow Removal & Snow Emergency Information

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the City may declare a "Snow Emergency". Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

Compost/Leaf Pickup Season Ends December 6th

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees **MUST** be placed in 30 gallon paper waste bags or 32 gallon or smaller refuse containers marked "compost" or "yard waste".

Snow And Ice Removal Required

Although we may still be enjoying the warm weather of late summer and early fall, it is important to look ahead to the upcoming winter season that will be here shortly. As a very walkable community, with an extended network of sidewalks, it is critical that residents and businesses do their part to keep the sidewalks clear of snow and ice.

City ordinances require that "The occupant of any premises, or the owner of any unoccupied premises, is required to keep the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to such premises cleared, so far as is practicable and reasonable, from snow and ice to facilitate pedestrian use. Where there are no sidewalks, the occupant or owner shall clear a

path free from snow and ice where a sidewalk would otherwise be, to facilitate pedestrian use. Whenever any snow or ice has fallen or accumulated, it shall be cleared within 12 hours after it has fallen or accumulated." Failure to remove the snow and ice according to the timeframe of the ordinance may result in the City of Mount Clemens performing this task and placing a lien against the property for all costs incurred, or issuing violation notices against the property.

We all hope this winter season is not a harsh one, but in the event that it is, the City thanks you in advance for your diligence in keeping the sidewalks of Mount Clemens safe.

The Mount Clemens Firefighters would like to thank everyone who came out to support us for our annual pancake breakfast. As always, it was a great day raising money for charities and getting to


see so many citizens who support us. We would like to thank Hefling's Amish Farm Market for their continuous generosity.

We're counting on You! The 2020 Census is coming!

The U.S. Census Bureau will be mailing information regarding the 2020 Census to all residents in March, 2020. Census forms need to be completed and returned to the Census Bureau by April 1, 2020, preferably online.

Why is the Census important? The information compiled helps the federal, state and local government plan for the services they require and provide to residents. The population of each city and state

help determine congressional representation, funding and state revenue sharing to local communities. The higher the population, the more funding and representation the City will have at the state and federal level. When residents don't complete the survey form, the City misses out on crucial funding that cannot be adjusted until the next Census in ten years.
