MAYOR'S UPDATE:

A Season of Momentum—and Bright Lights Ahead

Neighbors and friends,

The timing of our Clementime's Newsletter print deadline happens to be before the November Election. It is my greatest hope that as you are reading my update, I am still your mayor! As we turn the page into December, January, and February, I want to look back on a fall season that was one of the busiest—and most meaningful—our

city has seen in years. Together, we've taken major steps to secure reliable infrastructure, reactivate our downtown, and set the stage for a strong year ahead.

Breaking ground on our Drinking Water Connection project. This milestone represents years of planning, state partnership, and diligent work by our City team and commission. It's a once-in-ageneration investment to ensure safe, reliable, and affordable water for Mount Clemens residents and businesses. Thank you to everyone who helped move this forward; it's a textbook example of fiscal responsibility paired with long-term vision.

A new future at 20 South Main Street. The City's purchase of 20 South Main opens the door to a modern municipal campus and new possibilities for our riverfront. Relocating City Hall and the Fire Department will free up valuable waterfront property for future mixed-use development and public space—growing our tax base while keeping the riverfront accessible to all.

Cherry Street Mall and Macomb Place: open again. Reopening these key corridors is a major step in our Downtown Revitalization Project. Thank you to our residents, visitors, and especially our downtown merchants for your patience during construction. With each phase, we're building a safer, more walkable, more beautiful downtown that will serve us for decades.

State of the City: clarity, candor, and community. This fall's State of the City Address was a chance to share clear progress and practical next steps—from infrastructure to recreation, from fiscal stability to public art and parks. I'm grateful to City staff, our partners, and every resident who shows up, asks good questions, and helps us keep moving forward together.

Voting precincts will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, and there will be nine days of early voting for both elections.

UNSOLICITED VOTING MATERIALS

Please note that the Mount Clemens City Clerk's Office does not send out unsolicited voter registration applications or absentee ballot applications to residents. When residents receive these unsolicited voting materials, it is usually sent to them by political parties or voter interest groups. Because these groups do not have access to any municipality's voter database, they do not know the status of voter registration and may send the applications to residents who are already registered—resulting in a great deal of confusion and frustration to voters. Similarly, these groups have been known to send absentee ballot applications to voters who have already sent their completed application back to the City, prompting voters to believe that their original application was never received.

Voters who are unsure if they are registered to vote in Mount Clemens, or wish to check the status of their absentee ballot, may call the Clerk's Office at (586) 469-6800, option #4, or visit the Michigan Voter Information Center online at www.michigan.gov/vote.

HOLIDAY REFUSE CALENDAR

Christmas Day - Thursday, December 25, 2025

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, December 25th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule on Thursday, December 25th and Friday, December 26th. Garbage pickup for Monday, December 22nd through Wednesday, December 24th will be picked up *on schedule*.



COMPOST/LEAF PICKUP SEASON ENDS DECEMBER 5TH

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pick up policy this fall. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees **MUST** be placed in 30 gallon paper waste bags or 32 gallon or smaller refuse containers marked "compost" or "yard waste."

ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY. YOUR COMPLETE COOPERATION WILL BE APPRECIATED.



NEW Parking Kiosks

The City has removed the single space parking meters and installed two new Pay Stations in the New Street Municipal Parking Lot. One of them is located near Pine Street at the entrance to the lot and the other near the entrance to Cherry Street Mall from the lot. There will also be two of these machines placed on Macomb Place, one near Pine Street and one near Walnut Street. The machines have a full alphanumeric keypad and color screen, allowing users to input

their license plate number and choose the desired amount of parking time. The user follows the prompts on the screen and enters the required data (license plate number, and amount of time) the machine computes fee. Once payment is confirmed the information is stored in the system and the user can then choose whether or not they want to print a receipt. Payment options currently include coins, bills, credit cards, and contactless card.

Winter Snow Removal

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snow storm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the City may declare a "Snow Emergency" per City of Mount Clemens Ordinance #30.030. Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snow storms or excessive snowfall.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Vehicles not removed from the streets during a Snow Emergency may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, or the Snow Emergency has been terminated, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

Christmas Tree Pickup

Christmas trees can be placed at the curb with your regular garbage. Please make sure that trees are bare and not in a plastic bag when placed at the curb.

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, May 25th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, May 25th through Friday, May 29th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, June 1, 2026.

Independence Day – Saturday, July 4, 2026

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire week of June 29th through July 3rd, as Independence Day falls on Saturday.

Labor Day - Monday, September 7, 2026

There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 7th. Pickup will run one day behind schedule for the entire week beginning Monday, September 7th through Friday, September 11th. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 14, 2026.

Columbus Day – Monday, October 12, 2026

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during the entire month of October.

Veterans Day – Wednesday, November 11, 2026

Garbage pickup will run on schedule during Veterans Day week – November 9th through November 13th.

Thanksgiving Day – Thursday, November 26, 2026

There will be NO garbage pickup on Thursday, November 26th. Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday, November 27th and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday, November 28th. MICHIGAN SHIPWRECKS: THE WESTERN RESERVE




In August of 1892, millionaire Peter G. Minch took his family on a cruise bound for Minnesota aboard the fully-crewed Western Reserve. It was smooth sailing until August 30, when the vessel was met with rough conditions near Whitefish Bay. The ship, lightweight from carrying only human cargo, was no match for Lake Superior's waves.

The 28 passengers quickly boarded the lifeboats as the ship broke apart beneath them. The first, made up entirely of crewmen, flipped as soon as it hit the water. The second was about 30 miles off the shoreline. The storm continued and the sun dropped.

Another ship approached. The survivors screamed and signaled to no avail. Drowned out by darkness, they went undetected. After ten hours of paddling, the Minch family and crew were just a mile from the shoreline when they were overturned. Harry Stewart, the sole survivor, shared the only first-person account of what happened to the Western Reserve...
