

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

For Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant Application

Funding for Bike Path Connection Project

The City of Mount Clemens will host a public hearing on **Monday, September 21, 2026, at 6:00 PM**, in the City Commission Chambers located at Mount Clemens City Hall, 1 Crocker Boulevard, Mount Clemens, Michigan 48043, for the purpose of offering citizens an opportunity to examine and submit comments regarding the City's proposed application for Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding through the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

The proposed project includes a nonmotorized connection between Shadyside Park and South Main Street at the Robertson Street intersection. Improvements are anticipated to include shared-use path construction, ADA-accessible curb ramps, pedestrian crossing enhancements, pedestrian safety improvements, bicycle accommodations, signage, pavement markings, and other related infrastructure intended to improve nonmotorized connectivity and safety within the City of Mount Clemens. The project will provide improved access to downtown Mount Clemens, local parks, residential neighborhoods, the Clinton River Spillway bike path and the regional Freedom Trail network, which connects to destinations throughout Macomb County and Lake St. Clair Metropark.
